Australian Matriculation (AUSMAT) is a pre-university programme that offers flexibility to explore diverse academic and career interests. It remains one of the few globally recognised programmes. Contrary to popular belief, AUSMAT students frequently receive offers from universities in Hong Kong, New Zealand, U.K., U.S., Germany, Singapore and even public and private universities in Malaysia. Since 2012, enrollment for AUSMAT@MCKL has increased threefold, making it one of the top programmes of choice.

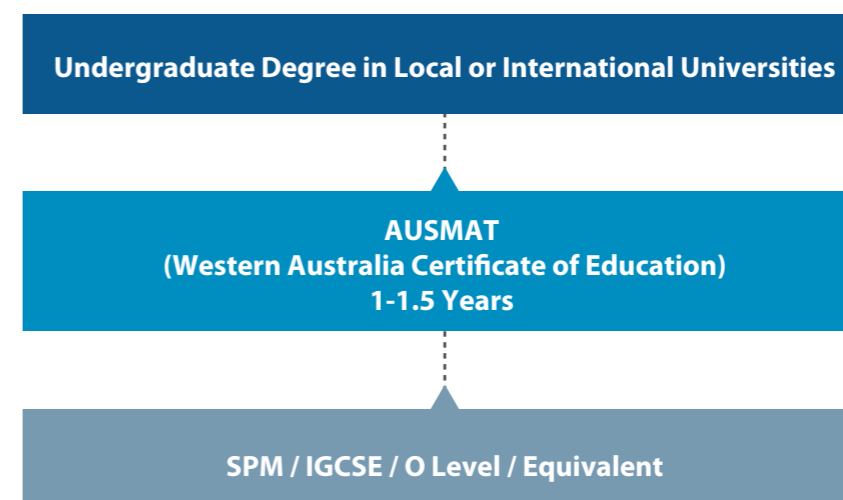
Grading System



AUSMAT students' final results will be a single score known as Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR). This score is derived from each student's best four subjects.

The ATAR score shows the ranking relative to other students from the same year. If a student achieves 99.0 ATAR score, it means that the student achieved higher results than 99% of students from the same year.

The Australian Matriculation (AUSMAT) is an internationally recognised pre-university programme. The School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) of Western Australia, on behalf of the Government of Western Australia, oversees the implementation of the AUSMAT programme according to SCSA guidelines.

The programme is well-structured with a balanced emphasis on coursework and external examinations. Academic scores are based on continuous school assessments and external examinations held in November.

Upon completion of this programme, successful students will be awarded the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and gain entries into top universities of their choice both locally and abroad.

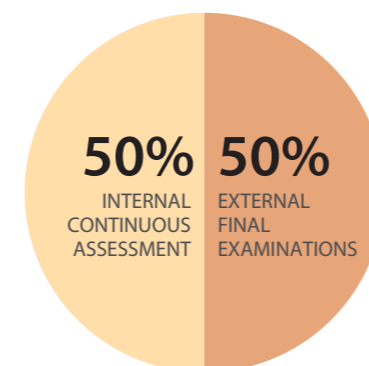

- ATAR courses are only offered in January & June intakes.
- General subjects and Human Biology (ATAR course) are only offered in the June intake.
- August intake students will need to re-register their courses in the subsequent January semester allowing them to choose different course combination depending on the course requirement.

ATAR ASSESSMENT MODE



The continuous school-based assessments consist of topic tests, quizzes, assignments, investigations, research and examinations. The diverse assessment tasks cater to the varied capabilities and aptitudes of the students.

WACE EXAMINATION*:

November, March

WACE EXAM RESULTS:

December, May

WACE ACHIEVEMENT REQUIREMENT:

Complete 4 or 5 ATAR courses with minimum 3 Cs out of the 4 or 5 courses selected.

Pass the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA).

OLNA EXAMINATION:

March & September

* Set and marked by SCSA.

- SCSA conducts moderation exercises to validate the school standards and their comparability with the schools in Western Australia.
- For General subjects no ATAR exams only an External Set Task (EST) will be set by SCSA which will account for 15% of the overall weightage, the remaining weightage will be through assignments administered by MCKL.
- All courses offered are subject to SCSA's offering and availability.

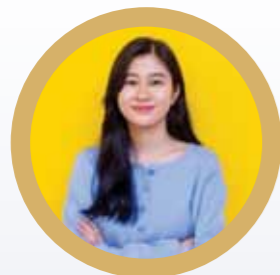
